REPORT TO THE MAGISTRATE JUDGE

In accordance with the settlement agreement between the United States and the City of Philadelphia and the settlement between the parties in the above-captioned case, the United States provides this bi-monthly report for the period of June 10 to July 31, 2009, on the status of the United States' polling place surveys. Copies of the surveys have been provided to all the parties.

This report provides only a summary of the actual survey results. If the Court would like further information, copies of the surveys can be provided as well.

ACCESSIBLE POLLING PLACES

The following polling places have been surveyed by the 3rd Party and have been determined to be accessible under the standards agreed to in this case. For these polling places, we indicate whether the accessible entrance is currently the primary entrance, whether the accessible entrance should not be re-designated as the exclusive entrance, or whether the accessible entrance currently is not designated as the primary entrance to the polling place but should be re-designated as the exclusive entrance.

Ward 25, Division 11-22, 2889 Cedar Street, Cohocksink (COHOX) Rec. Center.
Uses Cedar Street as the primary and accessible entrance.

Ward 35 Division 05-32, 6500 Tabor Rd., Philadelphia Protestant Home.
Uses the accessible entrance off the parking lot as the primary entrance for voters who are not residents. This is an accessible entrance. (Note: Main entrance at the time of the survey, was under construction to be made accessible.)

Ward 41, Division 06, 07, 6201 Torresdale Ave., American Legion Recreation Center.
Uses the rear sloped entrance facing the basketball courts. This entrance is accessible and is the primary entrance used by most voters on election day.

Ward 41, Division 23, 24, 25, 7300 Cottage Street. Edwin Forrest School.
Uses accessible entrance at the rear of the building as the primary entrance. This accessible entrance is used by most voters.

Ward 55, Division 5-7, 6455 Walker Street, Roosevelt Recreation Center
Uses the accessible entrance closest to Walker Street facing the basketball courts. This is the primary entrance and used by most voters and it is accessible.

Ward 55, Divisions 10, 15, 3001 Robbins Street, Lower Mayfair Recreation Center.
Uses the accessible double doors facing Robbins Ave. as the primary voting entrance. This is the primary entrance and is used by most voters on election day.

Ward 55, Divisions 25, 26, 27, 4131 Unruh Street, Vogt Recreation Center
Uses the main accessible entrance to the center, this has double doors facing Cottage Street. It is the primary entrance and is used by most voters.

Ward 56, Division 06, 1304 Rhawn Street, Gloria Dei Estates.
Uses the main entrance to the banquet/ meeting room at the side of the building, off the parking area as the primary entrance for voting. This accessible entrance is used by all (who do not already live in the building).

Ward 56, Division 15, 7328 Castor Avenue, Lee's Hoagie House
Main entrance is used by all voters.

Ward 56 Divisions 26, 28, 8500 Bustleton Avenue, Jack's Deli
Side entrance used by all voters.

Ward 56 Divisions 29, 39, 8900 Roosevelt Boulevard, Robert Saligman House
Side marked entrance facing Roosevelt Boulevard is used by all voters.

Ward 56 Division 32, 8040 Roosevelt Boulevard, Office Building Foyer
Rear parking lot entrance to be used by all voters. Relocate primary voting entrance to this location since front entrance on Roosevelt Boulevard has a step.

Ward 56 Divisions 34, 40, 7600 Roosevelt Boulevard, Valmont Towers Apts.
Main entrance in front of building is used by all.

Ward 57 Divisions 04, 06, 2425 Welsh Road, Casino Deli Restaurant
Rear parking lot entrance is accessible and used by all voters.

Ward 57 Division 5, 9233 Roosevelt Boulevard, Welsh Road Branch Library
Front main entrance is accessible and used by all voters.

Ward 57 Division 21, 9151 Academy Road, Penn Crisp Athletic Club
Front main entrance is accessible and used by all voters.

Ward 58 Divisions 02, 32, 37, 43, 595 Tomlinson Road, Loesche School
Main entrance facing Bustleton Avenue is accessible, and used by all voters.

Ward 58 Divisions 04, 22, 1001 Byberry Road, Comly School
General public uses a side entrance that leads directly into polling area, but wheelchair bound voters must use the school's main entrance (which is accessible) and travel around the school to the current polling area. Recommend relocating polling area to main entrance lobby near accessible entrance.

Ward 58 Divisions 06, 07, 11047 Bustleton Avenue, Philadelphia Korean Reform Church
Main accessible entrance is used by all voters

Ward 58 Division 24, 29, 1400 Southampton Road, Somerton Youth Club
Main double doors are used by all voters. (This entrance is also accessible).

Ward 58 Division 35, 12003 Bustleton Avenue, Shalom Arbor House (Ephraim Goldstein Apartments)
Automatic doors at main entrance are used by all voters (who do not already live in the building).

Ward 58 Division 44, 9896 Bustleton Avenue, Paul's Run Senior Center
Automatic doors at main entrance are used by all voters (who do not already live in the building).

Ward 63 Division 02, 7902 Oxford Avenue, Memorial Presbyterian Church
Side entrance facing parking lot is accessible and used by all voters.

Ward 63 Division 06, 7518 Verree Road, Residence of Bill and Kathy McConnell
All voters access polling area through garage door. (Space is unheated; recommend using a space heater on colder election days).

Ward 63, Division 10, 12, 8001 Verree Road, Knowlton Mansion
Uses the double doors from the parking lot as the primary entrance. Accessible and is used by all voters.

Ward 64, Division 03, 3515 Welsh Road, Marsico Caterers
Uses the front doors facing Welsh Road. This primary voting entrance is used by all voters and is accessible.

Ward 64, Division 04, 05, 7818 Frankford Ave., Fire Engine Co. #36.
Uses fire house main door as the primary entrance and this is used by most voters and it is accessible.

Ward 64, Division 07, 2840 Holme Ave., Northeast Community Center
Front door is the primary entrance. This entrance is ramped and accessible. This entrance is used by voters.

Ward 65, Division 01, 02, 4500 Linden Ave., Torresdale Boys Club
Currently the primary entrance to the club is off the asphalt parking area immediately adjacent to street. The entrance is accessible and used by all voters.

Ward 65, Division 10, Stevenson & Frankford Ave., John M. Prezel Education & Technology Center.
The current accessible, new, entrance path is off of Grant Ave. to the current primary building entrance. The driveway up from Frankford Ave. is too steep to be accessible. The primary building entrance is accessible and used by most all voters.

Ward 65, Division 16,17, Ditman & Rhawn Streets, Holmesburg Recreation Center
Currently the primary entrance to the building are the front doors. This also is the accessible entrance and is used by all voters.

Ward 66, Division 02, 07, 10980 Norcom Road, Norcom Community Center.
Currently the rear door facing the parking lot is the primary entrance. It is also the accessible entrance and is used by most all voters.

Ward 66, Divisions 04,16, Academy Rd & Torrey Rd, Fitzpatrick Recreation Center
Currently the primary entrance is at the side of building facing the parking lot. Entrance is accessible and used by most voters.

Ward 66 Divisions 06, 34, 3301 Mechanicsville Road, Parkwood Youth Center
Front door adjacent to parking area is used by all voters (it is also accessible).

Ward 66 Divisions 09, 14, 12770 Dunksferry Road, Junod Recreation Center
Front door is accessible, and used by all voters.

Ward 66, Division 39, 11088 Knights Road, YMCA
Front doors of the building are for the primary and accessible entrance and voting is in a classroom.

Ward 66, Division 43-30, 4430 Deerpath Rd, Chalfont Recreation Center
Uses the primary entrance which is accessible in the front of the building. Polling is split into two separate accessible rooms.

POLLING PLACES THAT MAY BE MADE TEMPORARILY ACCESSIBLE ON ELECTION DAY

The following polling places have been surveyed by the 3rd Party and have been determined to be inaccessible under the standards agreed to in this case. For these polling places, there is a temporary measure(s) that may make them accessible on election day. We include the temporary measures as well as the identification of the polling places. Additionally, for these polling places, we indicate whether the accessible entrance is currently the primary entrance, whether the accessible entrance should not be re-designated as the exclusive entrance, or whether the accessible entrance currently is not designated as the primary entrance to the polling place but should be re-designated as the exclusive entrance.

Ward 07, Division 11-15-19, 3200 B Street, Stetson Middle School.

Uses primary entry on Allegheny Ave for all voters.

1. Provide 4'-0" long temporary ramp at entry step.
2. Prop open entry door.
3. Prop open corridor door(s).
4. Prop open doors to voting area.(s)

Ward 09, Division 16, 7801 B Stenton Ave., Chestnut Hill Village Apartments.

Uses main accessible entry to building for most of the voters.

1. Provide a wedge shaped sill extension at threshold of entry door.
 - a. Alternate: Provide short interior ramp and prop open entry door.

2. Prop vestibule door(s) open.
3. Prop open door(s) to voting area.

Ward 25, Division 05, 2987 Almond Street, Richmond Library.

Currently uses the ramped entry to the basement which is not accessible.

1. Relocate voting room to the library reading room and use the accessible ramp up to the library reading room.

Ward 25, Division 07, 2700 E. Auburn Street, Carroll School.

Uses the accessible ramped entry on Auburn Street which is a separate entry used for wheelchairs that could be designated as the exclusive entrance. Suggested but not required: Move polling location to lobby, adjacent to the accessible entrance.

1. Temporarily remove entrance door astragal and prop door(s) open.
2. Prop open corridor door(s).
3. Prop open gymnasium door(s).

Ward 41, Division 02-09-10 & W55 Division 02; 6101 Jackson Street, Lawton School.

Currently side doors to cafetorium (Entrance "C") is used by most voters but they are not accessible.

1. Relocate accessible entrance to the main entrance door(s) for all voters to use.

Ward 41, Division 04, 6179 Hegerman Street, Wissinoming Ambulance.

Main door, not garage door, to building is accessible and used by most voters.

1. Prop open entrance door.
2. Prop open corridor door.

Ward 41, Division 05, Fire Company 52, 4501 Van Kirk Street.

Currently the man door is usually used by voters, however, it is inaccessible.

1. Re-designate the overhead apparatus door as the exclusive accessible entrance to be use by most all voters.
2. Apparatus door is to be left open.

Ward 41, Division 22, 4343 Princeton Ave., Kiddy Kottage Daycare Center.

Primary entrance is at corner and used by all voters.

1. Provide a wedge shaped sill extension at entrance door threshold.
2. Prop open entrance door.

Ward 41, Division 26, 7341 Cottage Street, Saint Bernard's Church Rectory.

Primary entrance is located at the back door to the rectory facing the parking lot.

1. Provide 6'-0" ramp at back door entry at step.
2. Prop doors open.
3. Prop open corridors doors.

Ward 45, Division 01, 4750 Richmond Street, Fire Engine Co. #33.

Uses fire house apparatus door as the primary entrance used by most voters.

1. Apparatus door to be left open.

Ward 45, Division 07, 2520 E. Ontario St., Fire Engine Co. #28

Uses both fire house apparatus door and main door as the primary entrances.

1. Apparatus door needs to be left open and/or the main door needs to be propped open.

Ward 45, Division 18, 3796 Kensington Ave., Fire Engine Co. #07.

Uses fire house apparatus door as the primary entrance used by most voters.

1. Apparatus door to be left open.

Ward 50, Division 28, 7210 Ogontz Ave., West Oak Lane Older Adult Center.

Currently uses main entry as the primary entrance and is used by all voters.

1. Entrance doors to be propped open.

Ward 55, Division 09, 13, 3001 Levick Street, Saint Timothy's School.

Currently uses accessible door(s) located off the school parking lot and is used by most all voters.

1. Place temporary accessible parking sign in parking spaces.
2. Inside of threshold of entry doors has sharp lip and needs repair.
3. Corridor door(s) need to be propped open.

Ward 55, Division 12, 3117 Longshore Ave., Johnson Memorial Methodist Church.

Currently uses the double-doors facing Hawthorne Street as the primary voting entrance. This entrance is used by most voters on election day.

1. Entrance doors to be propped open.

Ward 56, Division 04, 1601 Cottman Ave., Northeast High School.

Currently uses the main entrance off Algon Street as the primary voting location used by most all voters.

1. Designate temporary accessible parking spaces on Algon Street on election day.
2. Place several temporary outdoor directional signs showing path to the main entrance of the building from Algon Street.

Ward 56, Divisions 10, 36, 7701 Loretto Ave., Rhawnhurst Presbyterian Church.

Currently uses the entrance off side of building facing Loretto Street as the primary voting location used by most all voters.

1. Entrance doors to be propped open.

Ward 56, Divisions 12, 18, 20, 21, 8185 Bustleton Ave., Rhawnhurst Recreation Center.
Currently there 2 separate primary voting entrances at the front of building facing the parking lot.

1. Vestibule and interior doors to be propped open.

Ward 56, Division 22, 2101 Strahle Street, Federation Apt. Bldg. Tabas House

Main building entrance, accessible from parking lot

1. Disable entry bell
2. Unlock front door

Ward 57 Division 12, 8900 Convent Ave, Crispin Gardens Meeting Room

Main entrance to meeting room used

1. There is no sidewalk on the side of street where the building is located; There are also no curb cuts for the 6" curb. Recommend either creating a curb cut or using temporary ramp.
2. Entrance door must be propped open, or door handle must be changed to an accessible one

Ward 57 Divisions 17, 18, 28, 8724 Crispin Street, Pennypack Woods Home Association

Front entrance to building is used by all voters (accessible from rear parking lot).

1. Building uses several rooms for polling; interior door to these rooms may need to be propped open.

Ward 57 Divisions 22, 25, 9550 Frankford Avenue, Torresdale Recreation Center

Main double doors facing Frankford Avenue are used on by all voters

1. Sidewalk path in front of accessible entrance has no curb cuts; recommend creating one or using a temporary ramp for the 3" curb.
2. Pathway leading up to accessible entrance needs repair; cracks and imperfections in pavement could become barriers.

Ward 58 Divisions 01, 42, 9820 Bustleton Avenue, Municipal Building

Side entrance facing Bowler street is the accessible entrance, also used by most voters.

1. Doors into polling area need to have their knobs replaced with accessible handles, or they must be propped open on election day.

Ward 58 Divisions 03, 31, 10400 Roosevelt Boulevard, St. John Neumann Nursing Home

Side entrance to auditorium is the primary entrance.

1. From side entrance, interior doors must be propped open

Ward 58 Divisions 08, 15, 18, 36, 10155 Bustleton Avenue, Washington High School

Current entrance used is inaccessible side entrance with four steps up to building.

1. Relocate entrance to main entrance of school (this is accessible)
2. Relocate polling place to school's main lobby (this space only has one outlet, recommend use of an extension cord to accommodate the 4 current divisions)

Ward 58 Divisions 11, 14, 28, 42, 2000 Bowler Street, Anne Frank School

General public uses gymnasium entrance, but wheelchair bound voters use front main entrance.

1. Designate main entrance as entrance for all voters
2. Change hardware on Main entrance doors to be accessible handles, or prop doors open
3. Replace interior door handles with accessible ones, or prop doors open.
4. Current polling location in gymnasium is accessed via an interior ramp without any hand rails; at least one handrail must be installed to current standards
5. Polling could be relocated to cafeteria instead of gym (this would alleviate the issues associated with the interior ramp, because it is not needed to access cafeteria)

Ward 58 Division 16, 9832 Redd Rambler Drive, Residence of Thomas Wilson Back door to enclosed patio is used by all voters as the primary entrance.

1. Thumb latch on door should be disabled by taping over keeper.
2. Polling area is in an unheated space; recommend using space heaters.

Ward 58 Division 20, 13073 Bustleton Avenue, Somerton Methodist Church

Most voters use the side entrance on Trevoise Road

1. Entrance door must be propped open

Ward 58 Division 39, 13021 Worthington Road, Fellowship Bible Church

Rear entrance adjacent to parking lot is used by most voters.

1. Temporary ramp or curb cut will be needed to address 2" lip from parking lot to accessible path
2. Thumb latch on entrance door must be disabled. Tape over latch.

Ward 62 Divisions 15, 16, 20, 21, 23, 24, 5935 Saul Street, Ziegler School (New Building)

Ramped Entrance facing Penn Street is used by all voters.

1. Entrance doors have no handles; must be propped open on election day, or have accessible handles installed.

Ward 63 Divisions 04, 09, 880 Rhawn Street, Fire Engine Co. # 56

All voters enter polling place through the apparatus doors.

1. Apparatus doors need to be open and remain open for voting.

Ward 63 Division 05, 7725 Bingham Street, Sehan Presbyterian Church

Front double doors are used by all voters.

1. Front double doors have knobs that must either be changed to accessible door handles, or doors must be propped open.
2. Door to polling room in building must also have its knob changed, or be propped open.

Ward 63 Division 07, 11, 8580 Verree Road, Lafayette Redeemer Room

Side entrance off of path to main entrance is generally used by all voters.

1. Side entrance door has thumb latch that should be disabled on election day. Set panic hardware to be dogged open.

Ward 63, Division 13, 8001 Jeanes Street, Fox Chase Library.

Currently the library's main accessible entrance is the primary entrance and used by all voters.

1. Doors may need to be propped open or adjust closer.

Ward 63, Division 14, 441 Hoffnagle Street, Stewart Katuran's Private Garage.

Currently the garage door is the primary accessible entrance and is used by all voters.

1. Garage door needs to be kept in the open position.
2. Provide temporary threshold at ¾" lip of garage door.

Ward 63, Division 15, 20, 22, 24, 8801 Verree Road, Baldi School.

The current entry used by voters leads to gym via a corridor and commons area, however a ramp was under construction to a side door of the gym during the survey. Only if it is finished with handrails can it be used. If handrails are not in place before elections then the old accessible entry requires the following:

1. Entrance door astragal needs to be removed and the doors need to be propped open.
2. Prop open interior doors along the path to the gym.

Ward 63, Divisions 25, 1104 Welsh Road, Chapel Manor Nursing Home.

Currently primary entry uses the ramped entrance to the left of the main entrance. The ramped accessible entry is used by all voters.

1. Disable automatic lock at entry door.
2. Prop open entry door.

Ward 64, Division 11, 3301 Cottman Ave., Fluehr Funeral Home.

Currently the first bay of garage on Crabtree Street is the primary entrance.

The entrance is accessible with the garage door always open and this is used by all voters.

1. Garage overhead door is to be left in the open position.

Ward 64, Division 15, 8205 Roosevelt Blvd., Fire Engine Co. #18.

Uses fire house apparatus door as the primary entrance and is used by most voters.

1. Provide temporary accessible parking signs on election day.
2. Apparatus door is to be left in the open position.

Ward 64, Division 16, 17, 3001 Ryan Ave., Meehan Middle School.

Currently uses a side entrance that includes steps at "little theater" to a small lobby as the primary entrance. The entrance by the flagpole is the accessible entrance and not the primary entrance. The flagpole entrance could have voting inside main lobby which would be better for general public also.

1. The accessible entrance currently is not designated as the primary entrance to the polling place but should be re-designated as the exclusive entrance.
2. Unlock entrance door on election day and prop open.

Ward 65, Division 12, 7212 Keystone Street, Hope Church Hall

Currently the primary entrance is front door which is inaccessible. Door adjacent to the rear parking lot is the door used as accessible entrance.

1. Re-designate the accessible entrance, which is not currently designated as the primary polling place entrance, as the exclusive entrance to the polling place.
2. Prop entrance door open.

Ward 65, Division 23, 9197 Frankford Ave, .Fire Engine Co. #46.

Currently uses fire house man door as the primary entrance which is used by most voters .

1. Man door to be propped open.
2. If overhead garage door is used it must be kept open.
3. Prop open interior door(s).

Ward 66, Divisions 01, 12, 2990 Southampton Road, Rillings Bakery

Uses the main store entrance as the primary entrance. The entrance is used by most voters.

1. Prop open vestibule and polling room doors.

Ward 66, Division 03, 22, 23, 38, 3500 Academy Road, Decatur School.

The primary entrance is not currently the accessible entrance used by most voters. The primary entrance has 2 steps up. The alternate accessible entrance is located on the opposite side of the bldg.

1. Re-designated the alternate accessible entrance as the exclusive entrance.
2. Provide signage to mark the pathway in the corridors to the gymnasium.
3. Ask the building engineer to unlock the accessible and re-designated exclusive entry door.

Ward 66, Division 05, 2980 Southampton Road, International Brotherhood of Painters & Allied Trades.

Current primary entrance is at the Fountain Room at the rear of the building. This entrance is accessible and used by most voters.

1. Prop open corridor door(s).
2. Prop open voting room door(s).

Ward 66 Division 11, 11201 Academy Road, Archbishop Ryan High School

Front main entrance is currently used by most voters.

1. Relocate accessible entrance to southern rear entrance adjacent to parking area

Ward 66 Division 13, 3237 Byberry Road, Residence of Florence Arkowitz

Garage entrance is used by all voters.

1. Screen door must be propped open.
2. Two inch lip at door needs a temporary ramp

Ward 66, Division 15, 11301 Academy Road, St. Martha's Gym

Currently uses front entry door but sloped walkway is not accessible. The entry that will be used by all will need to be moved to the entry at the far side of the gym which is level. Need to check for approval by owner.

1. Hold exterior door open on election day.
2. Provide signs outside pointing voters to this entrance which might be new to them.

Ward 66 Division 17, 3296 Comly Road, Fire Engine Co. # 22

Voting takes place inside the rear entry along Academy Road. All voters use the same entry.

1. Provide 6 foot ramp at entry door and prop door in the open position.
2. Provide 6 foot ramp at the curb from the driveway that leads to the sidewalk.

Ward 66, Division 20, 4150 Woodhaven Road, Faith Lutheran Church

The rear doors facing the parking lot and Whiting Street are both the accessible entrance and the entrance generally used by most voters on election day. The front of the building and the Woodhaven Road entrance to the driveway is not accessible for wheelchairs, Whiting Street driveway is.

1. Provide 6 foot ramp leading up curb to entry doors
2. Prop open doors to the parking lot
3. Interior doors to the voting area room requires being propped open.

Ward 66, Divisions 25-46, 11024 Knights Road, Our Lady of Calvary School

The side door leading to the gymnasium is both the accessible entrance and the entrance generally used by most voters. The entrance requires some temporary measures on election day:

1. Mark off an accessible parking spot near the entry using a temporary means.
2. On voting day take out the removable center astragal piece and also prop open the exterior doors so that there is a 32 inch wide clearance.
3. Prop open hallway doors that directly communicate with the gymnasium.

Ward 66, Division 26-27-28, 3700 Morrell Ave., John Hancock School

The rear door to the school facing Morrell Avenue is the entrance that can be made accessible with minor temporary modifications. This will need to be designated as the primary voting entrance.

1. A temporary ramp for a 3 inch rise is needed at the curb just outside the double doors of the polling area.
2. Center astragal of the accessible entry will need to be removed on election day.
3. Doors of accessible entry will need to be propped open on election day.
4. Accessible parking spaces will need to be reserved using temporary signs or some other means.

Ward 66, Division 36-45, 10800 Hawley Road, Labrum School

Currently the front doors that are used by most are not accessible. The service ramp at the rear is also too steep to be accessible. To continue using this building for voting the polling place will need to be moved to the cafeteria. Entrance to it is through the rear parking lot, up one step.

1. Prop the cafeteria's exterior door in the open position.
2. Provide temporary six foot ramp to exterior cafeteria door.
3. Provide exterior signage for voters used to the front entrance to know to go to the parking lot at the rear of the building.
4. Provide a temporary accessible parking place with signage or other means.

Ward 66, Division 42, 11080 Knights Road, St. Luke's U.C. Church

1. Relocate the primary entrance for all voters to the rear of the building which is the accessible entrance.
2. Prop open doors along the travel route.

POLLING PLACES THAT ARE INACCESSIBLE AND SHOULD BE RELOCATED

The following polling places have been surveyed by the 3rd Party and have been determined to be inaccessible under the standards agreed to in this case. The United States has further determined that temporary measures cannot be implemented to make the polling place accessible on election day. Where there is an existing polling place location that may house the division from the inaccessible location, the Third Party has included that recommendation.
